End of Term moments

The end of term came very quickly and we appreciated the patience and support from all of you as we unavoidably had to alter our moving plans and deliver additional days at the end of the Academic year to accommodate this. With the new move date now set, see below, we look forward to ushering in these new opportunities and to start September as we ended July. The end of June and July saw us increase our enrichment opportunities and trips. We saw a vigorous Army Day filled with leadership skills, Year 12 visit and given access to Portsmouth University to get a taste of University life and opportunities. We saw the RIAT Airshow opportunity dazzle our future engineers and those aspiring to keep our sky safe in defence and computer technologies. The Future frontiers programme and STEM workshops across years groups also broadened the opportunities for all and I am grateful to all the staff who gave of their own time and commitment to serve our children long outside of regulated hours to provide all of these opportunities.

We also saw the end of term rewards trip. I am grateful here to those parents who reached out to me, in particular about our rewards and recognition procedures. I have read, spoken to many of you and listened. I indeed agree that this needs an overhaul. This year it had already been budgeted for a limited number and next year we do not intend to run any event where students are punitively prevented from attending or participating in an event due to processes that are not aligned with out values and commitments to all. We are looking at ways to fund a rewards system that not only recognises talent and effort, but positively challenged all of us to become that best version of ourselves.

New Build Update - change of calendar dates for 2023/24,

I am finally delighted to be updating you with some good news with regards to the New Build Harlington School. Following a meeting on Friday 28th July we now have confirmation of some vital components that will allow successful completion of the building by the end of October making a November move in date the earliest possible time to move in. This will sadly cause some disruption to our current calendar dates. Having already had to change the previous schedule we are now in a position to update a schedule with a transition from the old building into the new building over the October half term. However it will be unavoidable that this will need to include packing and unpacking days either side, along with health and safety training and canteen induction for all students. This will currently affect the school calendar dates either side of half term from the 19th October until the 3rd November 2023.

The transition into the New Build requires the School to pack all internal items to be moved into the New Build, alongside unpacking these items and health and safety training and a fire drill into the New Building. For these moving days and induction days to work, for the health and safety of the whole community, it will cause an unavoidable disruption to our in school face to face teaching. This will be substituted over these dates by online learning and work booklets across the subjects.

The updated Calendar will reflect the following dates to accommodate the move;

Wednesday October 18th (Regular School Day - Last Day in current Harlington School building). School will end at the regular time. After School the systems servers, phone network and all IT related equipment will be shut down to allow the transfer of the server and IT equipment to begin. This transfer is scheduled to take 14 days.

Thursday 19th October – Friday 20th October – Exceptional move out packing dates. Students will be directed for these two school days to learn from home. Due to no available IT facilities all learning will be scheduled through third party providers, through work booklets or directed tasks. Staff will be required in School to assist in the packing of all the current equipment that will be transported into the New Building. Therefore we will require these two days to pack away the current building ready to be transported into the new building.

Monday 23rd October - Friday 27th October - HALF TERM remains as scheduled

Week of Monday 30th November – Students learning remains directed at home. Due to no available IT facilities all learning will continue to be scheduled through third party providers, through work booklets or directed tasks.

Monday 30th October – Wednesday 1st November – Exceptional Staff move in days with Wednesday 1st November scheduled as a staff INSET new build induction day.

With the requirement for staff induction into the New Build on the 1st November, it will be imperative for us to also move the current scheduled staff training day for the 24th November to the 1st November. We believe that this will also minimize disruption for everyone.

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Thursday 2nd November – New Build Health and Safety Induction - Induction Day - A $1\frac{1}{2}$ hour Induction time for Years 11, 10 & 9.

Friday 3rd November – New Build Health and Safety Induction - Induction Day - A 1 ½ hour Induction time for Years 7, 8 & VI Form.

Monday 6th November - School Opens for ALL year groups to return into the New Building

Future Frontiers



I enjoyed it the student ambassador from Brunel university were really caring and they helped understand the task better


