Overall Harlington School is very pleased to announce that it has bucked the national trend decline mentioned by government statistics and the national press. Of these figures we are above our 2019 levels and in line with our 2022 results with 54% gaining 5+ including English & Maths and 59% 5+ standard pass grades 4 and above.
