Looking Ahead


As we move through January, students will continue to settle back into routines following the Christmas break. The coming weeks will focus on consistent attendance, positive behaviour, and strong engagement in learning.

Dear Parent/Carer/Guardian,

We have noticed an increase in the number of parents seeking to drop off and collect their children from the front of school. As a reminder, we politely ask all parents not to enter our front car park or stop on Pinkwell Lane but instead use the entry point at the rear of our school.

This is for logistical and safety reasons:

We have community transport who drop off and collect students and the minibuses are unable to exit the car park due to the amount of congestion. **We also feel the amount of traffic poses a significant health and safety risk to our children, staff and members of the public.**

We therefore ask all parents to drop off and collect students from the rear of the school which can be accessed via the GOALS entrance on Shepiston Lane.
