Congratulations! to our superstar Year 13 students who received their A-Level results yesterday.

We saw a fantastic set of results that continue to grow and this years grades saw a continued 3-year trend rise in our **A-B grades rising to 40%**. From this figure we saw 15% of grades securing an A* or A spread across 27 students.

We also saw a great deal of individual successes with students getting into prestigious Russell Group Universities including Oxford. Currently we have over 20 confirmed for places on Russell group Universities.

You will all be a great loss in many ways to the school community and a great gain to the Universities you choose to join.

The overall final destination picture is still developing as universities process 'Clearing' decisions and we continue to collect information directly from students. However, the position so far is extremely encouraging.

Some of the current headlines are:

- **Around 80 students are already confirmed at university or currently have a university offer/choice progressing through UCAS**, with further outcomes still being finalised.
- **At least 20 students have confirmed places to attend Russell Group universities**, and this figure may increase as remaining clearing decisions are processed.
- Our Russell Group destinations currently include **Oxford, King's College London, Warwick, Manchester, Nottingham, Sheffield, Southampton, Cardiff** and **Queen Mary University of London**.
- Most significantly, **Jasmine Hemmings has secured a place at the University of Oxford to study Biology**, which is a fantastic achievement for Jasmine and a significant milestone for Harlington Sixth Form.

- A number of students who began Results Day without a confirmed university destination have subsequently secured or are progressing alternative offers through clearing. A great thanks to Mr Jana and the Sixth Form Team for their work on results day helping students navigate clearing and University acceptance offers.
- We are also recording students progressing into **degree apprenticeships, employment and structured gap-year pathways**, so the overall positive destination figure will extend beyond university progression alone.

What has been particularly pleasing is the amount of movement we have seen since the beginning of Results Day. Students who initially appeared as unplaced have been supported individually to explore clearing, alternative courses and universities, degree apprenticeships and other pathways. A number of those outcomes are still being processed through UCAS, so the formal data continues to change. I thank the team who continue to work diligently on this to ensure we secure positive next stage destinations.

There remain a small number of students whom we are actively supporting, and I will continue monitoring UCAS and following these students up over the coming days. Therefore, I would stress that **these are positive headline figures rather than our final destination data**.

Nevertheless, I think the emerging picture gives us a great deal to celebrate and provides some excellent stories to share with our parents and community. I wish to thank all of my colleagues for their valuable contributions in ensuring how we got here and in enabling the celebrations and positive outcomes celebrated today.

Finally, to the parents who have suffered and endured along this journey, we thank you for all your connections and support in enabling the successes of today to resonate. None of this would have been possible without your support. Your child should be assured that the results they receive today have been fully earned as a result of their hard work and achievements over the last two years. These results open the door to the next chapter of their lives, and we wish them well moving forward.
